#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Mrs. Lucci's Resource Centre is a non-profit organization operating in the community of Lac du Bonnet. Currently we offer programming through Healthy Child Manitoba and Dept of Families (CLDS) Adult Services. We operate 2 second hand stores, one for clothing and children's items, and the other for furniture and housewares. We also offer space to the following;

- a) Sunrise Alternative Learning Program (renter)
- b) Provincial health Inspector (renter)
- c) Child and Family Services (renter)
- d) IREHA Family First and Healthy Baby (renter)
- e) AFM (free space)
- f) Family Therapy Counselling (free space)

Mrs. Lucci's is located at 76 Third St. The building is approximately 4,500 square feet. The main floor consists of; a 1,055 sq ft second hand store, 422 sq ft café, 331 sq ft kitchen, 361 sq ft multipurpose room, plus a central resource centre space. There are five offices upstairs.

Mrs. Lucci's also owns a house at 76 Third St, which is used for the Adult Day Program. We rent space (approx. 2000 sq ft) at 67 Park Ave for our second hand furniture and housewares store.

Mrs. Lucci's operates with a Board of Directors made up of broad community representation. The Board meets on average four times/year.

# **Profit Sharing Program**

#### **Programming**

# 1) Healthy Child Manitoba

Due to the pandemic, all in-person programming normally offered at the elementary school and the Resource Centre was suspended. Staff continued to support community members through telephone contacts, zoom meetings, social media, off site and outdoor meetings, etc

Food security became a more pronounced issue in 2020. The Resource Centre received an invitation to deliver a new program funded by Direct Farms Manitoba. Twenty five individuals and or families who would not otherwise afford, are given currency to access fresh produce and meat at the farmers market. Recipes and education rounded out the program.

# 2) Adult Services

Due to the pandemic, all programming followed strict guidelines. For mental health reasons clients were allowed to participate one on one. With the exception of six weeks, the stores remained open and clients enjoyed the

opportunity to see people in a safe and protected environment. Clients supported independent living needs were met throughout the pandemic.
